Subject:- Grant of 3rd Renewal of Permission to Shri Santan Pal Singh Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital Village Noorpur Tasrora, Mirzapur, Tehsil Jalalabad, Shajahanpur-242221, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0638) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2026-27 and relevant regulation thereunder- reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Shri Santan Pal Singh Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital Village Noorpur Tasrora, Mirzapur, Tehsil Jalalabad, Shajahanpur-242221, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0638)** inspection was conducted on **11.05.2026 and 12.05.2026 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2026-27 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report shortcomings/defects were observed and** same was placed in the **168th Board meeting of MARBSIM held on 05.08.2026** and Board decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to your college.
- 3) In view of above an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no. dated 20.08.2026** was granted to your college to appear on **24.08.2026** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the permission to your college with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2026-27, under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 be reassessed as per Punitive policy.**
- 4) The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter. Ref. No. SSPSAMC/2026/214 dated 21.08.2026** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Principal of the college Dr. Honey S.R. Prasad,** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **24.08.2026** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college.
- 5) Thereafter, observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms regulations, namely, "Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024, and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020, the observation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **175th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 02.09.2026 and Board concluded that the college is fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations. However, Board decided to issue 3rd Renewal of permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2026-27.**

"DECISION"

- 6) **Therefore, 3rd Renewal of Permission is hereby granted to Shri Santan Pal Singh Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital Village Noorpur Tasrora, Mirzapur, Tehsil Jalalabad, Shajahanpur-242221, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0638) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 64 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2026-27 subject to the condition that the following requirements shall be fulfilled:-**
- I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of with 60 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2026-27 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- 7) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 8) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 9) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10) **Compliance report of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the implementation letters vide ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS dated 09.05.2024 and 06.09.2024 issued by the board.**
- 11) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2026 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2027-28 :-**
- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- 12) The College administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of 4th batch of students in the 1st professional BAMS is made under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
- 13) The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time in accordance with the Regulation (66) of MESAR 2024 which will be verified by the medical assessment and rating board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
- 14) The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
- 15) The fulfilment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2027-28.

- 16) Further, in case you are not satisfied with the decision of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM, you may prefer an appeal addressed to the Chairman, NCISM, within 15 days of issuance of the decision of the Board as per regulation 65 of MESAR 2024 and section 29(5) of NCISM Act 2020.

Note: - It is also noted that, if the concerned University does not grant affiliation to the college or withdraws the affiliation, the permission granted by MARBISM shall automatically stand withdrawn without any further notice or order.
