EXTENSION OF CONDITIONAL PERMISSION

Subject:- Grant of Extension of Conditional Permission to Shri Santanpal Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Mirzapur, Tehsil Jalalabad, Shahjahanpur-242221, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0638) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Shri Santanpal Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Mirzapur, Tehsil Jalalabad, Shahjahanpur-242221, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0638)** inspection of your College was conducted on **25.05.2023 & 26.05.2023 on hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the Extension of Conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
2. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under.
3. As per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report was placed in the **54th Board Meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **22.08.2023**. On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that **your college is fulfilling the notified & approved criteria. Hence the Board decided to issue Extension of Conditional Permission for conducting 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24.**
4. Therefore, **Extension of Conditional Permission is granted to Shri Santanpal Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Mirzapur, Tehsil Jalalabad, Shahjahanpur-242221, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0638)) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24** subject to the condition that college is fulfilling the following requirements: -
 - I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the colleges/hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant rules and regulations.
 - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 60 seats** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of

that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.

- III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
6. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular or the subsequent academic year.**
7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
8. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2024-25: -**
- i) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- ii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda).
- iii) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
9. The College administration will ensure the availability of sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, before the admission of the 3rd batch of students in the 1st professional of BAMS is made, under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
10. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time as per the norms which will be verified by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
11. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
